As the world is facing a series of linked environmental crises we strongly believe we have to act and do something in our private and professional life. In October 2022, the UN warned that the world's governments are not yet on track to keep global heating below 1.5 degrees, and the window for action is rapidly closing.

We are already seeing the impacts of existing warming with devastating droughts, storms and floods across the world. Related crises include collapsing biodiversity, dangerous levels of air pollution, and plastic contamination in our rivers and oceans. Without urgent action from across society, these problems will rapidly escalate.

The art world has an important role to play. Arts organizations – particularly in the Global North – have a disproportionately large impact on the environment, mainly due to a great deal of international travel, arts shipping, and high use of energy and materials. We need to act urgently to reduce these impacts in line with what the science is telling us. As arts organizations, we also have an opportunity to use our public platform and cultural influence to set a positive example, encouraging and supporting others to take action and helping shift the public debate.

At TAMARA KREISLER Gallery, we commit our values and mission to educate our audiences in the care and respect for our planet with the organization of art shows that show the impact of Climate Change as well as working with artists that have a strong concern about our planet's wellbeing and by working with providers that are environmentally responsible. All done from positive perspective and looking for solutions.

As an art player, we know that our main direct environmental impacts include air travel and freight and energy use in the gallery, our commitment is to decrease when possible this impacts and decrease our carbon emissions by 2030, from a 2024 baseline by regularly calculating the carbon footprint of our operations, to track progress towards this target.
